

SES Supplemental Educational Services

In year two and beyond of Program Improvement Status, students who score below proficient in either the English language arts or math STAR tests, and also participate in the federal lunch program, are eligible to apply for supplemental educational services (SES).

Belle Air school has been identified by the California Department of Education as a 2nd year Title I Program Improvement (PI) school. During the 08-09 school year, 186 students tested below proficient in English language arts or math and were eligible to receive services. An evening "Providers Fair" was held to promote enrollment and to give parents access to available providers, materials and help with registration. The Belle Air parent liaison was available for translation and assistance. Parents unable to attend were contacted and encouraged to register. There were 67 requests for SES services. All 67 students participated in the SES onsite after school tutoring program provided by three state approved providers; Carney, Kaplan and Tutorworks. During the 08-09 school year each SES participating student received supplemental educational services up to the cost of \$645.42 from school/district Title I funds with an approved SES Provider. Total cost of the required program was \$35,117. Other school funds provided after school tutoring by teachers for another 106 students.

The "Request for SES Tutoring" application is available on the San Bruno Park School District website as well as the school office. A list of state approved support services is also available at the school or on the cde.gov website. If demand is greater than the funds available, federal law requires that priority be given to the lowest achieving students who are also from low-income families.
